## Information Points

## Explore the St Patrick's Campus

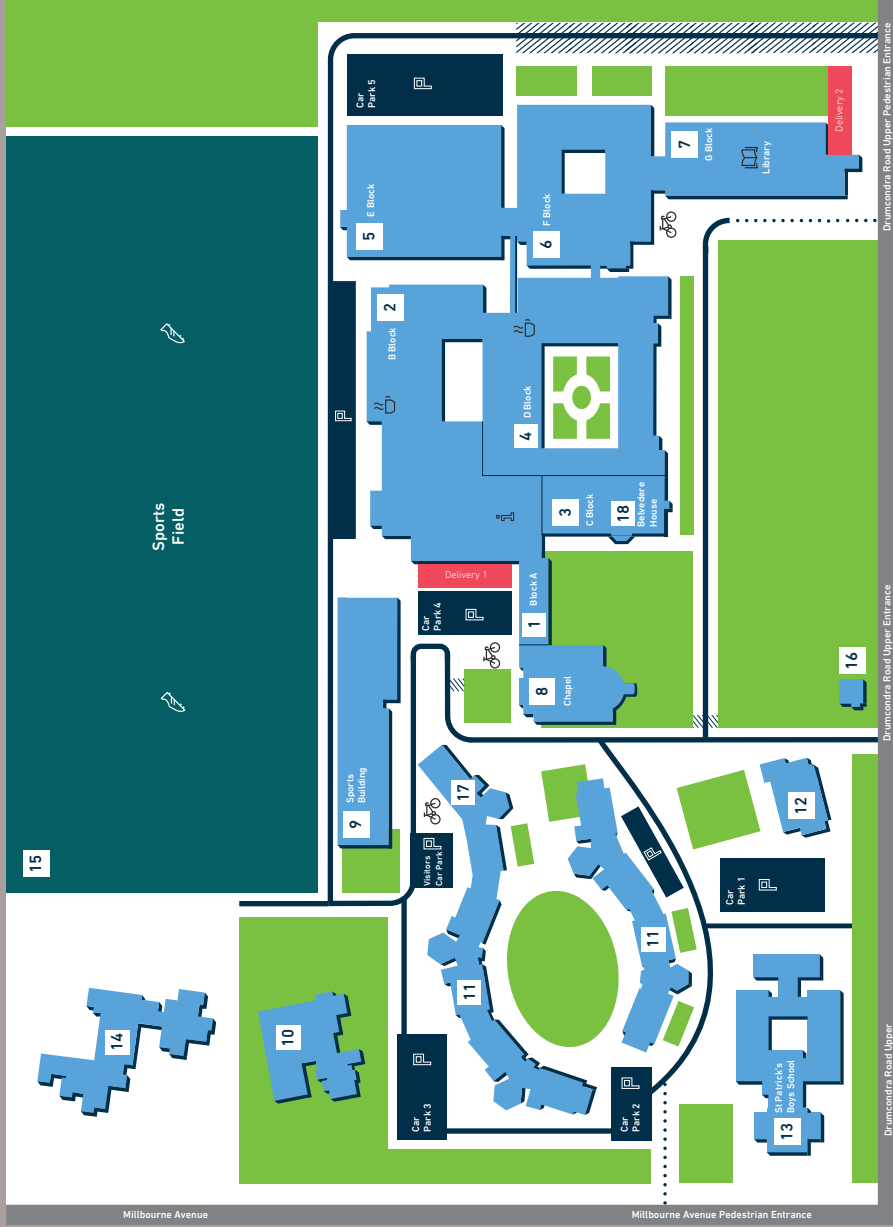
## Catering Facilities

## Complimentary Bus to Glasnevin Campus
